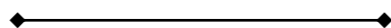

## Gaudete et Exultate - Rejoice and be Glad

SUMMARY OF APOSTOLIC EXHORTATION GAUDETE ET EXULTATE OF THE HOLY FATHER FRANCIS  
ON THE CALL TO HOLINESS IN TODAY'S WORLD

This is not an academic or doctrinal text. Its goal is "to repropose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time."  
CHAPTER 1: THE CALL TO HOLINESS

There are many kinds of saints. Besides the Church's officially recognized saints, many more ordinary people have been hidden from history books yet have been decisive in changing the world. They include many Christian witnesses whose martyrdom is a feature of our time. "Each saint is a mission, planned by the Father to reflect and embody, at a specific moment in history, a certain aspect of the Gospel." Holiness is experiencing the mysteries of Christ's life, "constantly dying and rising anew with him", and reproducing aspects of his earthly life: his closeness to the outcast, his poverty, his self-sacrificing love. "Allow the Spirit to forge in you the personal mystery that can reflect Jesus Christ in today's world", in a mission to build the kingdom of love, justice and universal peace. Holiness is as diverse as humanity; the Lord has in mind a particular path for each believer, not just the clergy, the consecrated, or those who live a contemplative life. We are all called to holiness, whatever our role, "by living our lives with love and bearing witness", and in the everyday turning to God. Among ways of bearing witness are "feminine styles of holiness", of famous women saints and the "unknown and forgotten" women who daily transform their communities. As well as through big challenges, holiness grows through small gestures: refusing to gossip, listening with patience and love, saying a kind word to a poor person. Holiness keeps you faithful to your deepest self, free from every form of enslavement, and bearing fruit for our world. Holiness does not make you less human, since it is an encounter between your weakness and the power of God's grace. But we need moments of solitude and silence before God, to face our true selves and let the Lord enter.
