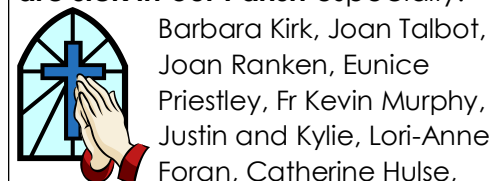

Called to be inclusive

A catholic who was well known for his commitment to the faith and his services within his parish community went on a visit to a country town during his annual vacation. Within the holiday period, he fellowships with the local parish church located on the main street of the town. After attending masses four weekends in a role, he realized something strange. Guess what? No one spoke to him! Not even *hello or hi mate, how are you going*. He was ignored and sidelined all the time. Why? Because, he does not belong there. Discomforted and disappointed by his experience in the church, he shortened his holiday and returned to where he *belongs, his home parish, but the same church*.

This story reflects part of the attitude of John, one of Jesus' disciples who in the first paragraph of the gospel text this weekend reported to Jesus their action towards someone they considered an outsider, in the words of Luke: ...**who is not one of us...and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him**.

This attitude is alive and well in many quarters where, people feel excluded for the sake of their creed, opinion, values, background, gender, orientation and vulnerability. Around the table of the Eucharist where we are bonded by the waters of baptism and in the spirit of synodality and the ongoing Plenary Council Processes, we called to be inclusive in our attitudes and in our spoken and body languages.
