Today's Gospel message comes from Fr Dominic

In an earlier chapter Jesus enters Jerusalem and its temple and over turns the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold pigeons. He is then asked, "by what authority are you acting?" He answers with the question, "was the baptism of John from heaven or from men?" And so, because they cannot answer this they never learn of Jesus' authority. What has happened so far, or more importantly to indicate what is to happen, Jesus tells them the parable of the wicked tenants who rejected the cornerstone. Then Jesus is asked a series of questions, "is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar or not?" "In the resurrection whose wife will she be, for the seven had her as wife?" The question of today's Gospel, "which commandment is the greatest?" is the last in this series. And all these questions and the whole sequence preceding it illustrates that Jesus is overturning their rule, challenging them, and unable to be mastered by them. All along they have only questioned him and now the force behind their rejection has stopped with a question about the law and love. If you want to improve at doing something, then you need to exercise that something. Let us exercise love knowing the sanctity of life.
