I am the Way, the Truth and the Life

Today's readings tell us how the early Church accepted the challenge of keeping Jesus' memory alive in the Christian community by transforming the early Church as a serving and worshiping community (Acts 6: 1-7), as a spiritual edifice built of "living stones" of believers upon the "Living Corner stone of Christ" (I Pet.2: 4-5) and as the Father's house (John 14: 1-12).

Today's gospel gives the image of the Church as a Church in glory in the Father's house. It also reminds us of the great truth that Jesus is the Way to God, that he is the Truth of God and in him is God's own Life.





FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission to the faith.

That means that for you who are believers, it is precious; but for unbelievers, the stone rejected by the builders has proved to be the keystone, a stone to stumble over, a rock to bring men down. They stumble over it because they do not believe in the word; it was the fate in store for them.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me. There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I should have told you. I am now going to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too. You know the way to the place where I am going.'

Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus said: 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me. If you know me, you know my Father too. From this moment you know him and have seen him.'

Philip said, 'Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.' 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip,' said Jesus to him 'and you still do not know me? To have seen me is to have seen the Father, so how can you say, "Let us see the Father"? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself: it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work. You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other reason.

'I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

 - a. By actively participation in the Eucharistic celebration and property receiving the body and blood of Christ in the Holy Communion.
 - b. By the worthy reception of the other sacraments.
 - c. By the meditative and daily reading of the Word of God.
 - d. By following the guidance of the life-giving Spirit of God, living within us.,
 - e. By communicating with God the source of life, in personal and family prayers.

Dear Parishioners, Hope you are well and in good spirits at these times of isolation and lockdown Our hearts are heavy as we are unable to attend Church masses and liturgies

I am glad to inform you all, that throughout the last six weeks of lockdown period, Moruya Church had been busy doing maintenance, electrical works, gardening and other in and around the church and Presbytery. Pat Anderson has it reported already last week in the Caring Group Bulletin. Hopefully you have seen some pictures of it in last week's Parish Bulletin.

Electricity supply cable laid underground as per council requirements, an expensive work which was pending since two years. The Church bell has been fixed, exit sign lights and light around the Crucifix have been installed.

Concreting a portion of the drive way and garden bed fixed. A lot of work has been done to make the Memorial Rose Garden look alive, and office is fully active 3 days a week bringing out bulletins, keeping Parish records and accounts updated. All these are happening not with out costs, at a time the Church draws no income. In July 2020, we need to pay the Church Building yearly Insurance and other.
