The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'



A HEART THAT KNOWS ITS NEED FOR GOD

Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel offers us one of Jesus' most moving parables — the story of the Pharisee and the tax collector. Both men go up to the temple to pray, but their hearts could not be more different. The Pharisee stands tall, certain of his goodness and eager to list his achievements before God. The tax collector, meanwhile, stays at a distance, his eyes lowered, whispering only, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Jesus tells us that it is the humble tax collector — not the self-assured Pharisee — who goes home justified. This story reminds us that the Lord does not measure holiness by outward appearances or impressive deeds, but by the honesty and humility of our hearts. The one who knows their need for mercy is the one most ready to receive it.

In our daily lives, it can be easy to slip into comparison — to look at others and think, "I'm doing better than they are," or to quietly congratulate ourselves for being faithful or prayerful. Yet Jesus invites us to a different kind of prayer: one that is simple, sincere, and free of pretence. God already knows our hearts. He knows our weariness, our hopes, and our hidden struggles. All He asks is that we come before Him truthfully and trust His compassion.

Here in our parish, we are blessed to walk together as a community that tries, each day, to live the Gospel with humility and love. We see it in the quiet generosity of those who serve, in the faith of those who pray for others, and in the welcome extended to all who enter our church. May our parish always be a place where no one feels judged or forgotten, but where everyone encounters the gentle mercy of Christ.

Let us pray this week for hearts that are humble, open, and honest before the Lord — hearts that know their need for God, and in knowing, are filled with His peace.
