# Second Reading Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which vou are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

## Gospel Luke 13:22-30

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.

'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'



### "The Narrow Door: God's Wide Invitation, Our Personal Response"

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we hear someone ask Jesus, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Instead of giving a number, Jesus points us toward action: "Strive to enter through the narrow door." Salvation isn't about being near Jesus in name or tradition—it's about choosing to follow Him with intention and love. Isaiah, in the first reading, offers a vision of God gathering people from every nation and language into one family of faith. This is God's dream: a vast, diverse banquet where all are welcome. Yet the second reading from Hebrews reminds us that entering this life with God often involves discipline. Like a loving parent, God shapes us through challenges, helping us grow into people of strength, faith, and peace.

Together, these readings carry a clear message: God's invitation is wide, but our response must be personal. We cannot rely on habit, status, or cultural belonging to bring us to the Kingdom. Walking through the "narrow door" means making daily choices that reflect Christ—acts of forgiveness, courage, generosity, and faith.

Jesus also warns that some who seem "first" may find themselves outside, while those who appear "last" may be welcomed in. It's a sobering reminder not to grow complacent in our faith or assume we've already "arrived." Instead, we are called to a living, active discipleship—a life of prayer, service, and trust that constantly deepens our relationship with God.

This week, the challenge is personal: Where is God calling me to walk more intentionally through the narrow door? Is it in letting go of grudges, showing patience, or putting prayer back at the centre of daily life?

Each step, however small, is a movement closer to Christ.

May we be strengthened by God's love, encouraged by His discipline, and inspired by His vision of a great banquet where all nations gather. Let us run this race with perseverance, keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, so that when the door opens wide, we may joyfully enter and share in the feast prepared for us.
