A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites vou to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No: when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'

"Choosing the Lower Place: The Joy of Humility"

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday's Gospel (Luke 14:1, 7–14) invites us into the heart of Jesus' teaching on humility. At a banquet, Jesus notices how guests choose the places of honour for themselves. He gently turns their thinking upside down, saying: "When you are invited, go and sit at the lowest place... For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

It's a striking reminder that God's Kingdom doesn't run on status, power, or recognition. Instead, it grows in humility, service, and generosity. To follow Christ is to let go of self-promotion and to live in a way that lifts others up.

In the first reading, from Ecclesiasticus, we're told that "conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts." Humility isn't weakness—it's wisdom. It allows us to see life and people as God sees them. And in the second reading, Hebrews paints the image of the heavenly Jerusalem, reminding us that our lives are leading us toward a banquet where God Himself is host, and where true honour is given not to the proud but to the faithful. Jesus goes further in the Gospel by challenging us about who we invite into our lives. Instead of only sharing meals with friends, relatives, or those who can repay us, He calls us to welcome the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind—the people who have nothing to give back. This is the heart of Christian love: to give freely, without expectation, because that's exactly how God loves us.

So this week, let's reflect: where is God inviting us to choose the "lower place"? Who in our lives might need to be lifted up by a word of kindness, an act of generosity, or an open seat at our table?

May we learn the joy of humility, the freedom of self-forgetful love, and the blessing of welcoming others as Christ has welcomed us. And when the great banquet of heaven is revealed, may we be found in the company of the humble, sharing in God's glory.
