O Most Holy Virgin, immaculate in body and spirit, look kindly on us as we implore



A Sacred Moment of Lent!

Prayers for you all that you may have a wonderful journey of Lent!

On Wednesday, the Ash Wednesday, we began our journey to prepare ourselves to celebrate the high point of our Christian life, the Easter. On that day, we received the ashes on our foreheads as a reminder of our life journey especially the spiritual journey. In one level, the ashes remind us of our origin and death when we received the ashes with a prayer said: "Remember that you are dust and to the dust you shall return." The ashes also remind us of the victory over evil and death by the death of Jesus. We acknowledge that victory when we "repent and believe in the Gospel," as we receive the ashes with this prayer.

As you may have been aware of, that the spiritual journey we walk on is not always easy and smooth. There may be some obstacles and challenges on the journey. In today's Gospel, we hear that the Spirit drove out Jesus into the wilderness. It is a reminder and the strength for us that Jesus has traced the journey before us. He has walked the way. He is calling us to follow him by caring our own crosses.
