Mourning of the death of a Pope

The nine days of mourning for the loss of Pope Francis. With the death of Pope Francis on Monday, the Catholic Church has entered a mourning period, which will include nine days of Masses offered for the repose of his soul known as the "Novendiales."

Rooted in ancient Christian and Roman customs, the Novendiales is a period of nine consecutive days dedicated to mourning the death of a pope. The practice dates back centuries, mirroring the ancient Roman tradition of a nine-day funeral rite.




According to Church law, while the mourning period begins immediately upon the pope's death, marking the official start of the "sede vacante," or papal interregnum, the Novendiales will begin on the day of the pope's funeral, scheduled for April 26, and will be followed by consecutive days of Masses until May 4.

The Canonisation of Bl. Carlo Acutis

As we all are aware that, on April 27, the Church would have celebrated the canonisation of Blessed Carlo Acutis, marking the first millennial saint—a beacon for young people in the digital age. With Pope Francis' passing, this joyful event is postponed until the next pontificate. We remain inspired by his faith

and devotion, trusting that his sainthood will soon be officially recognised by the Church.



Carlo Acutis' journey to sainthood has unfolded alongside the lives of the last three popes, each of whom has marked a different chapter in the teenager's short life and legacy. Carlo went on pilgrimage to see John Paul II, offered up his suffering from cancer for Benedict XVI, and was later beatified during the pontificate of Pope Francis. Now, it will be up to the next pope to canonize the Church's first millennial saint.

May his life continue to guide and encourage all, especially the youth, to live with love and courage in Christ. Blessed Carlo Acutis, pray for us.

Conclave to elect new Pope to begin on May 7th

The conclave to elect the 267th Pope will begin on May 7th, following the conclusion of the nine consecutive days of mourning Masses to pray for the eternal repose of the late Pope Francis.
