

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER / A

17 May 2020

FIRST READING

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

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Reflections Gospel

'AT HOME' WITH GOD

In last week's Gospel Jesus reflected on two understandings of his 'going away' and 'return': first, his going away in death and his re-appearance three days later as risen Lord; second, his more final departure to the Father, to return only at the end of time. The section from Jesus' instruction that we hear today focuses upon that second, much longer period of absence.

As far as the non-believing world is concerned, Jesus will simply have ceased to exist. Believers, however, will continue to 'see' him with the eyes of faith and experience his presence in this way.

In loving him and keeping his commandments, they will participate in the mutual love that unites Father and Son, both of whom will 'make their home' within them. Though deprived of Jesus' physical presence, they and God will be mutually 'at home' in this sense.

In this connection Jesus speaks of 'another Paraclete' whom he will ask the Father to give. A 'paraclete' is someone who stands beside a person in time of difficulty, a supportive and encouraging presence. We might think, for example, of a highly respected person whom we might ask to go to court with us to act as a character witness. Though Jesus will no longer be physically present to carry out this role, the community will have 'another paraclete' in the shape of the Holy Spirit.

In the face of the world's hostility and doubt, the 'Spirit of truth' will offer reassurance that what they believe and seek to live by is the most profound truth.

ANNOUNCEMENT - RESTRICTIONS EASED

The NSW Premier has announced changes to COVID-19 restrictions which will bring NSW in line with the ACT effective Friday, 15 May 2020.

Please note the following:

- **1.** Churches may now be open but will be restricted to **no more than 10 people** in the building at any time.
- 2. Mass may be celebrated for no more than 10 people, excluding those conducting the service.
- **3. Funerals celebrated inside the church building are restricted to 20 people**, excluding those conducting the service.
- **4. Funerals celebrated outside the church building are restricted to 30 people**, excluding those conducting the service.
- 5. Weddings may now be celebrated with 10 people, excluding those conducting the ceremony.

These gatherings are permitted with the physical distancing rule of 1.5 metres. No physical sign of peace is permitted and the current protocols for Holy Communion remain in place (in hand only).

FR GEORGE'S REFLECTION

We thank God for bringing us together once again, for the progress made with containing Covid 19 and for being able to celebrate the Eucharist together as a family after seven long weeks. Glory be to the Father and to the son and to the Holy Spirit.

Today, in our Gospel reading, Jesus continues to exhort his disciples about his imminent departure and return to the Father to be glorified. This seemed to sadden his disciples who were always looking at him with that physical, human gaze, that only believes in, accepts and clings to whatever can be seen and touched. However, Jesus gives them the assurance that "I will not leave you orphans" (Jn 14:18). I send the Holy Spirit, the Counsellor, the Paraclete, a Helper, an Intercessor, the Spirit of truth (Jn 14:16-17) to be with you for ever. In the same way, we are not abandoned and alone in these trying and difficult times of Drought, Bush Fires and Covid 19. We are rather reassured of the Holy Spirit who is always with us through with us through thick and thin.

How many words of fostering, trust and promise reach out this Sunday to us! In the midst of our daily worries — when our Heart is overwhelmed by the shadows of doubt, of despair and of weariness for all those things that seem to have no solution at all or that have reached a blind alley—Jesus urges us on to feel that He is always present and to realise that He is alive and loves us, while, at the same time, He guarantees to whoever firmly decides to live and abide by His commandments, to show himself in the plenitude of the new and resurrected life

Today, He appears alive and present before us, in the teachings of the Scriptures that we listen to, and in the Eucharist that we shall receive. —Make your response to be that of a new life that surrenders to the appalling reality of his commandments, in particular that of loving.
