

"A turning away from and turning back to"

We are entering into a sacred and precious moment, the season of Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. We begins this season from Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar.

Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" or "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. It is symbol and a reminder to turn away from our sins and to turn back to God. This s a time of preparation to celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter.

These ashes are from the palms we have on the Palm Sunday previous years. These palm leaves are burnt and their ashes are used for making the signing of the cross on our foreheads in the Ash Wednesday Celebration. Now let us enter this precious and wonderful time of Lent by turning away from our sins and turning back to God by believing in and living out the Gospel!
