FEAST OF ST MARY OF THE CROSS

Mary MacKillop is with us. Her own experience of life leads us to be in deep communion with her as we celebrate. We remember that Mary herself suffered from ill-health. She is close to all those whose health has been impacted by the COVID-19. She was close to death on a few occasions and found comfort in those who shared these times with her. For those who are losing their jobs and finding themselves unemployed, Mary MacKillop also knows what this experience is like. Her father was not able to hold down a permanent job leaving the family constantly on the move and placing extra stress on family life.

She knows the sadness resulting from isolation. She responded to her isolation, not looking to her external world, but looking to the fertile ground of her inner life. Her composure and stability came from her fervent dependence on the love of her "good God". Her message is clear in this time of lockdown, restriction of rights, fear and panic in society. She says to us, "Find God first in your heart. Then see your God everywhere. Cheerfully accept the unexpected kindness of others and reciprocate. When your heart is free, you can be full of hope and joy so that, like the Easter women, you too can meet the Risen Jesus and recognise him in your neighbour".
