<u>Archdiocese Notice</u> Cost of each Priest in a parish in our Archdiocese

As a result of research with the Inner North parishes re-configuration, the following information is being offered to all parishes in the Archdiocese. This research coincides with a serious downward trend across the Archdiocese for the First Collection (Presbytery Account - that goes to the Central Presbytery Fund from which all our priests are paid). The 2024 financial breakdown is:

Fr Joe's Report

The recent priest's retreat was a great source of encouragement to Father Joe in his ministry here at the parish. He is focusing on inviting parishioners to participate in ministries and groups in the parish to support him in his ministry and build the unity of the parish.

Parish Finances

Parish finances were stronger though still slightly in the red.

School Report

Pupils are increasing rapidly with classes full across year levels including a year 12 cohort in

2024 of 20 students. Enrolments at present are at 480 for 2024 and increasing.

The school is currently recruiting staff to fill the growth of classes into 2024.

Baptism and Funeral Coordinators

There are four people who have begun in the new funeral ministry and one in the baptismal ministry. These volunteers will be trained to work with Father to deliver support for families preparing for these important ceremonies.

Fundraising

There are multiple fundraising initiatives in the parish at the present; The 100 club, Christmas Raffle, Street stalls, and the Parish dinner (*on the 8*th *December*) to celebrate the Parish Feast Day; starting with the Holy Eucharist at 8am and the dinner at 6pm at Tumut Indian Restaurant.

The committee will pursue possible local government grants to assist in various building and repair initiatives in the New Year

Church Restoration

There was a meeting in September and it was decided that priorities are the down pipes and these will be linked to the storm water. The committee is trying to achieve this before Christmas.
