1. THE SPIRITUAL NEED FOR HOME BLESSINGS

Blessing a home is not a mere ritual—it is a declaration that your household belongs to God.

- Inviting Christ to reign over your family.
- Placing your dwelling under angelic protection.
- Driving away evil and spiritual attacks.

2. WHEN SHOULD A HOME BE BLESSED?

When moving into a new house.
At the start of a new year or after renovations.

During times of spiritual struggle.
Regularly, to renew dedication to God.

4. THE CATHOLIC HOME BLESSING RITUAL

Step 1: Begin with prayer and the Sign of the Cross.

Step 2: Read Scriptures such as Joshua 24-15 or Psalm 91.

Step 3: Sprinkle holy water and mark doors/windows with the Cross.

Step 4: Dedicate the home to the Holy Family.

Step 5: Conclude with thanksgiving.

5. THE EPIPHANY BLESSING

On Epiphany (January 6), Catholics write above their doors.

This stands for *Christus Monsionem Benedicat* ("Christ bless this house") and recalls the Magi—Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.

This annual blessing serves as a visible witness that Christ reigns in the household.

Every Catholic must bless their home, for in doing so, they enthrone God at the very heart of family life.
