POPE FRANCIS: LEAVING BEHIND ONLY \$100 - A LIFE OF POVERTY AND COMPLETE SERVICE

Pope Francis, who passed away on April 21, 2025, at the age of 88, left behind only a personal fortune of \$100. This information has been confirmed by several reliable international news sources, such as Samaa TV and Parade, touching the hearts of those who have been moved by his simple lifestyle.

Despite being the head of one of the largest and wealthiest religious organizations in the world, Pope Francis chose to live as a true poor person. He declined the papal salary estimated at around \$32,000 per month and insisted on staying at the Casa Santa Marta instead of moving into the luxurious papal residence. He maintained the habit of cooking for himself and using public transportation—practices that he cherished since his time as the Archbishop of Buenos Aires.

Although he had access to many assets of the Vatican, the Holy Father did not accumulate wealth for himself. Some reports indicated that he received royalties from books and donations, but most of that money was directly channeled into charitable activities, in line with his spirit of "a Church that is poor for the poor" that he consistently advocated.

In his spiritual will published after his passing, Pope Francis expressed his desire to be buried simply at the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore in Rome—where he often prayed before his apostolic trips—rather than at St. Peter's Basilica as is traditional. He also requested that there be no papal title engraved on his tombstone and wished for the funeral expenses to be taken care of by an "anonymous person."

The death of Pope Francis leaves behind a profound lesson: a person can give up all fame, power, and possessions but still become great by living fully for love, for others, and for God. He completed his journey with empty hands—but a heart full of the Gospel, mercy, and generosity.

A life of poverty. A death in poverty. But it is the richest poverty the world has ever witnessed.
