This Sunday and next Sunday the young people preparing for Reconciliation and Holy Communion with their parents, will commit to engaging fully in the programs as they continue their journey in faith. They will also seek the prayer support of our community and ask a parishioner to take time in prayer each day as a sponsor. What a wonderful team we have with Brigitta, Geoff and Mary-Anne who attend the sessions on Tuesday evening with the parents and candidates.

On the 31<sup>st</sup> July there will be an 11AM Mass at Krawarree and the 21<sup>st</sup> August at Araluen. All parishioners from the region are welcome to attend.

Helen Delahunty (from the Archdiocese) will be visiting this Friday to discuss projects at both Bungendore and Braidwood. Besides a major building project at St Bede's we are also beginning discussions as to the future of the presbytery in Braidwood. The units in Bungendore will also be discussed as we continue consulting QPRC and their requirements to advance this project. There will be a Finance Council meeting in the next 2 weeks to discuss progress. As you would be aware Covid has had a serious effect on finances in all parishes, and the Trustees are also supporting the sale of land surplus to our needs for a cash flow for ongoing maintenance and support services.

#### **First reading**

Gen 18:20-32

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'

Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?' He said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more: perhaps there will only be ten.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the ten.'

#### Gospel

Lk 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy,

- your kingdom come;
- give us each day our daily bread,
- and forgive us our sins,
- for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.
- And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'



# Reflection

The readings invite us to reflect on prayer. Whether our prayer be praise, contrition, thanksgiving or petition, it always recognises our need for God. In the gospel Jesus instructs us to ask for what we need. He assures us that God is more than willing to give us what we need. However, for this to happen we must turn to God and humbly acknowledge our need.

The most obvious characteristic of prayer depicted in the readings for this Sunday is persistence. Neither Abraham nor the man in the gospel was deterred by any obstacle. They show that it is not so much that we persist in prayer in order to change God's mind as it is that we persist in order to discover what God's mind might be.

The usefulness of prayer is often found in the change that it effects in us, not in God. By persevering in genuine prayer we may come to acknowledge that all things are in God's hands, and that we can rest content to leave them there, trusting that the situation will be cared for as God sees fit. It seems trite to say that God hears all prayer and sometimes the answer is 'No!' It is better to say that God respects the freedom of people and will seldom intervene to change the way events unfold. Still, prayer can change the one who prays and

also the one for whom the prayer is offered if only human need is recognised and divine solicitude is acknowledged.
