Reflection

Far from an airy-fairy pious teaching, the Beatitudes are an incisive critique of the values and codes of behaviour found in the twenty-first century. In a world where success is measured by possessions, Jesus called blessed those who are poor in spirit. In a country where pain and death are avoided at all costs, Jesus called those who mourn. In companies and corporations where people jockey for power, Jesus called blessed those who are meek. In a litigious society that often seeks revenge, Jesus called blessed peacemakers and the merciful. Though Jesus taught the Beatitudes two thousand years ago, they remain timeless challenges and critiques of our contemporary culture.

Pray

Jesus, your Beatitudes turn the standards and ethics of our world topsy-turvy. They reveal to us that in the kingdom of heaven, there's more to life than meets the eye. Give us the grace to embrace these counter-cultural teachings and to live them out at home and in the office. May we come to be called "blessed". Amen. Ponder

1 Cor 1:26-31

Take yourselves, brothers, at the time when you were called: how many of you were wise in the ordinary sense of the word, how many were influential people, or came from noble families? No, it was to shame the wise that God chose what is foolish by human reckoning, and to shame what is strong that he chose what is weak by human reckoning; those whom the

world thinks common and contemptible are the ones that God has chosen – those who are nothing at all to show up those who are everything. The human race has nothing to boast about to God, but you, God has made members of Christ Jesus and by God's doing he has become our wisdom, and our virtue, and our holiness, and our freedom. As scripture says: if anyone wants to boast, let him boast about the Lord.

Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them:

Happy the gentle:

they shall have the earth for their heritage.

Happy those who mourn:

they shall be comforted.

Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right:

they shall be satisfied.

Happy the merciful:

they shall have mercy shown them.

Happy the pure in heart:

they shall see God.

Happy the peacemakers:

they shall be called sons of God.

Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right:

theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'

Communion Antiphon

Let your face shine on your servant.

Save me in your merciful love.

O Lord, let me never be put to shame, for I call on you.

Mindful Moment

I become still, aware of the Lord's presence with me, loving me just as I am. Perhaps I sense the warmth of his tender gaze upon me and rest with him for a few moments. Then I read these familiar 'Beatitudes' slowly and carefully, a number of times, taking them line by time, pausing wherever my attention is drawn. If it seems helpful, I may like to picture myself on the hill in front of Jesus, listening to his words as if for the first time. In each Beatitude, I notice what is being promised and to whom. Perhaps I think of 'happy' as meaning blessed, favoured, fortunate . . . Is there a 'happiness' or blessing that stands out for me? Is there one I'd really like to have? Or perhaps a mixture of them?

What blessing(s) do I desire for my family and friends, my community, the world . . .? What blessings do I see in my own life? I thank God for what I've been given. How do I want to respond? To whom can I be a blessing today? I try to be conscious of the Lord being gently present to me as I ponder these questions with him. When I feel ready, I slowly end my prayer, thanking the Lord for all his goodness. 'Glory be . . . '

A Message from Father Mick Burke

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This past week the Trustees will have signed a new lease agreement for the pre-school on behalf of our community. Whilst it is significantly less than could be achieved if we went to tender, nevertheless it will be a source of income for ongoing maintenance in the parish. This was a task entrusted to me on my appointment to St. Mary's. Next on the agenda is the sale of the Sutton land which will seed the larger project of the building of six units on our land. We have a buyer for the land but it needs the approval of the N.S.W government.

I'm in the process of forming a small team to offer a course during Lent to update interested parishioners in what we believe. It will be for an hour each week in Lent and is open to all people, especially those who want to know about the Catholic Church. There will be ample opportunity for discussion and questions.

Within the next two months I will have a Mass program for Braidwood and Bungendore parishes and the outlying stations attached to the parishes. This task hasn't been easy and will favour those who need to travel long distances. I am most grateful to Narelle and Greg Buckley who for the past four years have coordinated the Gundaroo community and I thank Di Sutherland for taking on this responsibility.
