Third Sundays will be shared between extra Masses at either Braidwood or Bungendore for First Communion / Confirmation or Mass at either Araluen or Nerriga.

Today in Australia we commemorate the 109th World Day of Migrant and Refugees.

Pope Francis' theme for this year's World Day of Migrants and Refugees is 'Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay'. In his message for the day, the Pope says eliminating the causes of forced migration needs a *"commitment on the part of all" and also" we are called to show maximum respect for the dignity of each*

migrant (in) a community ready to welcome, protect, promote, and integrate everyone."

For a decade Australia hasn't heeded the Pope's message to 'welcome and protect' refugees who came by boat. There have been recent improvements, but there is still more to do. Of urgent concern are:

- about 15,000 people who are not *'free to stay'* safely in Australia, as they live in destitution, unable to work but denied a financial safety net; and
- the people still held in PNG, whom the Australian Government has abandoned in unsafe conditions, with many not *'free to leave'* there for a safe country.

In the official Australian booklet for the Day, Archbishop Prowse suggests we reflect on our understanding of refugees and migrants, drawing on the flight of Jesus and his family into Egypt. Vinnies calls on Catholics to use the information in this booklet to pray for all migrants and refugees on 24 September.

Second reading

Philippians 1:20-24. 27

Christ will be glorified in my body, whether by my life or by my death. Life to me, of course, is Christ, but then death would bring me something more; but then again, if living in this body means doing work which is having good results – I do not know what I should choose. I am caught in this dilemma: I want to be gone and be with Christ, which would be very much the better, but for me to stay alive in this body is a more urgent need for your sake.

Gospel

Matthew 20:1-16

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'

Dear Parishioners,

The *Spring* is with us in all her beauty. We pause during our Mass and thank God for the gifts of nature and grace. The early Christians were clearly a grateful bunch, giving the name *'Eucharist'* to our treasured sacred celebration. The word, as you know, means 'thanksgiving,' and so the best way to *prepare for Mass* – both remotely and immediately – is to thank the Lord for everything we are and have.

We pray in a special way for *Father Vincent Michael Thomas Burke!* (I always address him in such fashion, having known him for years). Let's hope a couple of months recuperation finds him in better health, with a bright and fruitful retirement ahead of him.

The Archbishop has informed me that Father Joshua and I will be among you for perhaps *18 months*. The towns and parishes of Bungendore and Braidwood – and the surrounding areas – do need a full-time priest. In the meantime, we will do our best – under-promising and hopefully over-delivering.

For many years, the Archdiocese has gathered each year to celebrate what was known as the *Galong Procession* – honouring the Our Lady, Mother of God. It took place either in May or October. The Archbishop has decided, for a number of reasons, to switch the venue to the newly restored *Old Cathedral of Sts. Peter & Paul in Goulburn.*

Construction of the Old Cathedral began in *1872,* with rock quarried just outside Goulburn – Australia's first inland city. Believe it or not, it is the *only Greenstone Church in the world,* constructed with the rock that is – again, believe it or not – that is 440 million years old. It occupies a special place in world history.
