Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'

Dear Parishioners,

We live at a time of great change, which includes much violence and war. We should not underestimate the importance of *praying for peace* in the civil order. It a serious obligation flowing from our baptism. Equally important is our *inner disposition*. There is, flowing through the spiritual tradition of the Church, a *mantra* from so many saints and sinners:

Never lose your interior peace.

We celebrated the feast of *St. Margaret Mary Alacoque* (1647-1690) a few days ago. She was quite diligent in her spiritual life, but then along came the unexpected apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to her heart. She says:

Above all preserve peace of heart. This is more valuable than any treasure.

This advice came from her personal experience with Jesus:

This divine heart of Jesus is an abyss of all blessings, and into it the poor should submerge all their needs.

The heart of Jesus is an abyss of joy in which all of us can immerse our sorrows.

The heart of Jesus is an abyss of lowliness to counteract our foolishness.

The heart of Jesus is an abyss of mercy for the wretched.

The heart of Jesus is an abyss of love to meet our every need.

Some translations from the French use 'abyss,' others use 'ocean.' Either way, we get the gist and the spiritual import of her insight.

I hope this helps now and always. The peace of Christ be with each one of us.
