Dear Parishioners,

It is unfortunate that many people no longer know and live by the *Ten Commandments* (Decalogue), since they promote and protect fundamental human values:

God, Respect, Rest, Family, Life, Sexual Fidelity, Land & Property, Truthfulness.

We should not doubt that if we keep trying to live by these fundamental values we will be contributing to the benefit of others and society as a whole.

You will find a one-page sheet entitled 'Celebrating the Sacred Triduum Without a Priest.' (SEE BACK PAGE) In putting this together, I had to consider a number of realities:

We have Queanbeyan Parish, Michelago Parish, Braidwood Parish and Bungendore Parish (Gundaroo).

We can cover the Easter Sunday Masses (Queanbeyan 5.30pm, 8am, 10am, 5pm, Braidwood 5pm, Bungendore 8.30am & Gundaroo 10.30am), but not Holy Thursday and Good Friday in each community.

Faith celebrations on Holy Thursday and Good Friday can take place without a priest, but they are to be different in structure.

I consulted Father Peter Williams, the Vicar General of the Diocese of Parramatta, who is regarded as one of the pre-eminent Liturgists in the country. What you have in your hands is the fruit of a discussion with him.

What is suggested may not entirely satisfy all of us, but it does allow us to gather to celebrate with faith in a meaningful way. So, we can come together in a way that supports and aids faith.

Entrance Antiphon

While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Gospel

John 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon -sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

Celebrating the Sacred Triduum without a Priest

The Sacred Triduum consists of three celebrations that are in fact one (Holy Thursday, The Lord's Passion, Easter Vigil). It celebrates Jesus' 'passing-over' to his Father, for our salvation.

What do we do when it is not possible to celebrate the Paschal Triduum, with its three integral parts, because a priest cannot be present? Can we celebrate just one part? Holy Thursday, but not Good Friday or vice versa? Can we celebrate just the Easter Vigil?

Father Peter Williams, a well-renowned liturgist, strongly suggests the following liturgical acts when it is not possible to have a priest celebrate the Sacred Triduum.

Holy Thursday

Proclaim the Word of God (First Reading, Psalm, Second Reading, Gospel)
Washing of the Feet (Mandatum)
Prayers of the Faithful
Collection for the Poor

Notes: Holy Thursday focuses on the gift of Christian service, the Holy Eucharist, the Priesthood. However, the absence of a priest re-focuses the celebration entirely to Christian service (Washing of the feet & Collection for the poor). Liturgical instructions concerning Holy Communion are clear: 'Holy Communion may only be received by the faithful during Mass.' Father Williams concurs. A homily, prepared by the Parish Priest, can be read by a parishioner. Depending on numbers, a few lay people are assigned to perform the washing of the feet.

Good Friday

Stations of the Cross can be prayed by the faithful, but The Celebration of the Lord's Passion (normally celebrated at 3pm) does not take place, since the priest must play the part of Christ during the proclamation of the Word of God. The Veneration of the Cross replaces the Eucharistic Sacrifice (Mass) and so again, unfortunately, Holy Communion is not received.

Notes: It would be good for a variety of people to be involved in proclaiming the Stations of the Cross.

Easter Saturday Night

If Mass is celebrated on Easter Saturday night, then the Easter Vigil Mass is not celebrated, but rather the Easter Sunday Mass, with the readings and prayers that are set down in the lectionary and missal. The blessing of the Paschal Candle takes place after the homily and before the renewal of baptismal promises.

Comments: Many Catholic communities are unable to celebrate the Paschal Triduum, but as usual, it is not the end of the world. Much can be done in the absence of a priest and these celebrations should and will be full of faith.
