Armistice Day: We will remember them! Lest we forget!

Today, November 11th Armistice Day celebrations will speak of sacrifice and gratitude, mourn loss, grieve waste, and promise: "At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them." Rejoicing in the memory of war's ending, we will continue to pray for peace, lest we forget war's origins and horrors. Our yearly Christian practice of 'November-remembering' is similarly focused towards deepening our consciousness of what we cannot afford to forget. A recent **Tui Moto** prayer names it wonderfully:

Encourage us, Creative Spirit, to walk with footprints weighed in gratitude. To choose energy that sustains all life so that we leave only love in our trail.

The symbol for Armistice Day writes, Fr Andrew Hamilton, "became the blood-red poppy that bloomed everywhere in Flanders. It initially commemorated all the soldiers of the victorious armies who had died in the battle, but now honours the dead of many wars. It also celebrated the longed-for peace that followed the war and the hope that there would be no more war in their time. The poppies of the Flanders Fields also became



associated in Christian minds with the flowers of which Jesus spoke which neither toiled nor spun but whose beauty was a simple gift. They exemplified the trust that brings peace, just as the stinking mud of the trenches pointed to the mistrust that causes war."

Joy of the Gospel Day in Young - On Saturday 27th October, a large gathering of representatives from around the Western Deanery of the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn attended the "Joy of the Gospel" day at Young hosted by Fr Tony Percy. The morning consisted of excellent talks about Leadership and Mission in the Catholic Church, Christ and the Community and a Beauty and Power of Music video.
