#### Reflection

It's comforting, however, to know that Jesus can cope with our human weakness, with out moments of doubt. In fact, if we don't experience doubt, we will not grow into mature, adult faith. However, we can be sure that Jesus will not ignore us whenever we are courageous enough to call to him: "Jesus, save me. I'm going under." Lastly, our faith in God will be seen at its best when we find the courage to take the risk of reaching out to the stranger, of daring to go against the crowd when adhering to truth and integrity demand nothing less than that."
