Reflection

To Whom Can I be a Neighbour? The command to love our neighbour is as broad as our definition of the word, 'neighbour'. Are the people living next door the only ones we consider to be our neighbours? Do we include in neighbouring streets, towns, or countries and people of other faiths? Jesus answers these questions by telling the story of the Good Samaritan. As we hear this story we realise that the key question is never, 'who is my neighbour?', rather, 'to whom can I be a neighbour?'.

You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.

This Sundays readings focus on living out God's Word in everyday life. The readings encourage faith in action, love for others, and seeing Christ as the centre of all creation. Obeying God's Word: God's commandments are clear and close to us. The first reading reminds us that following God's will is not beyond our reach. Christ at the Centre: The second reading highlights Jesus as the foundation of creation and our faith. Everything exists through Him and is united in Him. Loving Your Neighbour: The Gospel calls us to love others, especially those in need. The story of the Good Samaritan challenges us to show kindness and mercy. Faith in Action: Faith is not just about knowing God's Word. The readings show that faith comes alive when we live it out through our actions. Compassion for Others: The Good Samaritan shows what compassion looks like. True love for God means caring for people, even strangers or those we find hard to love. God's Word
