Reflection

o, Lord, our God! The mystery of the Blessed Trinity is too deep for us now. but gradually the Holy Spirit will lead us to the fullness of the truth about God. Day by day we will grow in our sense of wonder that this God, who created the heavens and the earth, cares for us in an intimate, personal way. All we can do is cry out 'glory' to the one God, the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit.

It's not by accident that in our Catholic tradition the usual moment we invoke the Trinity is when we make the sign of the cross. There is a cost for living out our relationship with our Trinitarian God in our daily lives. Every time we profess the Trinity, we recommit ourselves to die to self so that God's saving love may be realised for everyone, everywhere.

The Glory Be Prayer

“Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.”

The Holy Trinity refers to the belief that there is only one God who exists in three distinct persons: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each of these persons is fully God, but they are also distinct from each other. The Glory Be prayer acknowledges the Holy Trinity by giving glory to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. By doing so, it recognizes the unique role that each person of the Trinity plays in the life of the faithful. The Father is the Creator and the source of all life, the Son is the Redeemer who saved humanity through his death and resurrection, and the Holy Spirit is the Sanctifier who guides and inspires believers on their spiritual journey.
