Plenary Council Six national themes for discernment announced:

Discernment on the national themes will be key to informing and shaping the agenda for the Plenary Council meetings in 2020 and 2021. These themes have been drawn from the data gathered from 17,457 submissions (taken from over 220,000 people across the country). The six national themes for discernment seek to address how God is calling us to be a Christ-centred Church that is:

- 1. Missionary and evangelising
- 2. Inclusive, participatory and synodal
- 3. Prayerful and Eucharistic
- 4. Humble, healing and merciful
- 5. A joyful, hope-filled and servant community
- 6. Open to conversion and renewal.

Now we are challenged to look forward, to face some "big questions", to listen to one another even more deeply as we discern:

- 1 How is God calling us to be a Christ-centred Church in Australia that is missionary and evangelising; inclusive, participatory and synodal; prayerful and Eucharistic; humble, healing and merciful?
- 2 How are we called to be a joyful, hope-filled, servant community, one that is open to conversion, renewal and reform?

May we continue to entrust the Plenary Council to the power of Holy Spirit.
