Reflection - "Eat my flesh, drink my blood." In the Incarnation, 'the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.' The Word continues to take flesh in the Eucharistic species and in all of us who partake of the flesh and blood of Christ in Communion: 'those who eat my flesh and drink my blood live in me and I in them.' Through the Eucharistic community, Christ continues to be enfleshed and to dwell in our world.



The Eucharist reminds us of divinity glimpsed through ordinary things, the bread and wine and the stuff of our lives. We bring to it our experiences along the way, and the fragility we find within ourselves. It is our constant reminder of how God comes into our world and is present, eager to 'protect and work with us'. In our prayer today, we cup in our hands our unshed tears for our losses, our hurts and pain, and our failings. We offer them to the God who meets us daily in the Eucharist, and whose love is always creating us anew. For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. (1 Cor 11:26)
