Reflection

'The Lamb of God.' Jesus is the Servant of God who brings salvation to the ends of the earth. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. He reveals the compassion of God who stoops down to hear the cries of those in distress.

Once every three years – in Year A – the story of Jesus' baptism is told twice. Matthew's version used on the feast itself *(last Sunday)* is followed today by John's. He describes the episode indirectly via the testimony of John the Baptist. While not stating explicitly that Jesus was baptised, the context and the reference to heavenly affirmation make it unmistakeable. Remembering Jesus' baptism thus serves a triple purpose. It rounds out the Christmas season, introduces Ordinary Time's account of Jesus' public ministry, and gives us an early hint of its culmination in his suffering and death as God's servant and Chosen One. It's an event that warrants and rewards timely reflection.

Bushfire Appeal
