Fr Andrew Hamilton writes sj, "We must foster hospitable hearts in order to foster hospitality to refugees. ... As we mark **World Refugee Day** on **20 June** this year, throughout the world preoccupied with coronavirus and the difficulties of overcoming it, people are tempted to be focused on their own lives, their own families, and their own nations. They may see people who are outside their own group or their own country sometimes as threats to their health to be expelled

and excluded, sometimes as a burden, and always as people to whom they have no responsibility. ... When the national mood changes from suspicion of outsiders to a more hospitable outlook, we must be ready to encourage it. Hospitality to refugees must begin in hospitable hearts which ultimately will outlive the walls that fear and prejudice erect against it."
