On Thursday we will celebrate the Feast of the Annunciation when Mary responded with her 'yes' that resulted in the birth of Jesus. We also know this event as the **Incarnation**. "The annunciation reveals Marv's humble nature.

She was young and afraid, yet brave enough to say yes to God. There's a selflessness to Mary—surely she had other plans for her life? It is hard to imagine a young person today on the cusp of adulthood prepared to put aside his or her own dreams for such an uncertain future. The announcement of the angel Gabriel must have put Mary's ideas about her life, however simple or predetermined, into a tailspin. What would the future hold now? Given the personal and social risk of having a child out of wedlock, the future must have looked frightening. Perhaps Mary found comfort in learning that Elizabeth was the beneficiary of a miracle too-a child in later age, joy beyond belief. We reflect on the feelings that Mary may have experienced—fear, confusion, wonder. Mary was ultimately obedient, ready to trust God. May her faith, courage and unselfishness be our inspiration."
