Archbishop's Visit to Temora

On Tuesday evening a sizeable group gathered to celebrate Eucharist with Bishop Christopher as well as enjoying a chat over a cuppa. One of the desires of the Bishop was to assure one and all of the closeness of Christ to each during this time of the pandemic.

A Reflection:

O God, please stay in your lane . . .

In an essay in The Christian Century [August 14, 2019], Rabbi Shai Held writes that much of our worship and religious practice amounts to a "hoax we try to perpetuate on God."

We say to God in effect: "We'll give You worship, and You just mind your own business. Your place is the church, the synagogue, or the mosque; butt out of our workplaces and our voting stations. You're the God of religion, not politics or economics.

And, Rabbi Held writes, "And God laughs. If you want to worship me, God says, you're going to have to learn to care what I care about — and who. And as the Bible never tires of telling us, God cares about the widow, the orphan, and the stranger; the poor, the oppressed, and the downtrodden. If those people don't matter to us, then God doesn't really matter to us either."

Today's Gospel does not square with the "deal" we believe we have with God. God's generosity strikes us as "unfair." We begrudge God's "extravagant," almost irresponsible mercy. But the parable of the generous vineyard owner exposes our tendency to evaluate everything in terms of dollars and cents, about getting the best deal possible — for me. But notice what's missing in the attitude of the workers in Jesus' story: grace. While we're pursuing fairness, God bestows grace in the form of generosity and understanding and second chances to the point of, in our estimation, foolish extravagance. Discipleship is to trust in the goodness of God despite our judgement of what is "fair" and "just." To trust in the mercy of God enables us to appreciate all that we have received at God's hand, compelling us to experience the joy of sharing all that we have been given with those who have not realized such blessings in their lives.
