Pope Francis latest Exhortation, Gaudete et Exsultate

Gaudete et Exsultate, released with relatively little fanfare after only a few weeks of expectation, is the fifth major document authored by Pope Francis over his five-year papacy, following the encyclicals Lumen Fidei and Laudato Si', and the exhortations Evangelii Gaudium and Amoris Laetitia.

The letter, which unfolds over 177 numbered points and five chapters, is marked by a very personal tone. The pontiff frequently addresses the reader individually throughout the text as "you," and asks direct questions meant to help each person examine his/her own quest for holiness. Repeatedly, the Pope stresses the need for Christians to both pray and serve others. The Pope considers how each person has their own path to holiness. He gives particular consideration to what he calls "the 'genius of woman," or, "feminine styles of holiness, which are an essential means of reflecting God's holiness in this world." ... Pope Francis explains how we grow in holiness step-by-step, using the example of a woman who goes shopping, meets a friend and is tempted to gossip but does not. She then goes home and wants to rest, but her child wants to speak to her. She listens to them instead of resting.

Earth Day, 22 April 2018

"See the world through the eyes of the Creator," Pope Francis said at the end of his general audience in St. Peter's Square on Wednesday, marking Earth Day. "I exhort everyone to see the world through the eyes of God the Creator: the earth is an environment to be safeguarded, a garden to be cultivated," he said. "The relationship of mankind with nature must not be conducted with greed, manipulation and exploitation, but it must conserve the divine harmony that exists between creatures and Creation within the logic of respect and care, so it can be put to the service of our brothers, also of future generations," the Pope said.

Celebrating Easter is more than belief; it involves action on our part.

If we really believe that Christ is risen and among us, it will be reflected tangibly in how we live. It may be expressed differently in each of us, but it will be evident.

But if we truly believe, those who encounter us will know it.
