# **Advent Wreath Prayer—Fourth Week**

Loving God, we thank you for your gift of love – shown to us perfectly in Jesus Christ our Lord. Help us prepare our hearts for the Lord's coming by loving others as Christ loves us. We ask this in the name of the one born in Bethlehem, Jesus our Lord. All: Amen.





Today we light the **Angel's** candle, *purple candle*.

Today, finally, **all four Advent Candles** will be lit in sequence. The Prophets' candle, then the Bethlehem candle, then the Shepherds' candle and, finally, the last purple candle will be lit. The **last candle** is the Angels' Candle and it serves to remind us that the Angels were the heralds of Jesus' birth. Together, all four candles symbolize that Jesus is the Light of the world.

#### Fourth Week of Advent - Slow Steps to Christmas—Mary & Joseph

As you will see in the crib at St John's Mary and Joseph have arrived – just like they

arrived in Bethlehem all those years ago to be registered for the census. "While they were there the time came for Mary to have her child and she gave birth to a son. ... The angel of the Lord appeared and the glory of the Lord shone round the shepherds. .. Today in the town of David a saviour has been born to you, he is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2: 7, 9. 11)



Richard Rohr writes, "Why do we love and admire kingdom people like Mary and Joseph, and then not imitate their faith journeys, their courage, their non-reassurance by the religious system? These were two laypeople who totally trusted their inner experience of God and who followed it to Bethlehem and beyond. Mary and Joseph walked in courage and blind faith that their own experience was true—with no one to reassure them they were right. Their only safety net was God's love and mercy, a safety net they must have tried out many times, or else they would never have been able to fall into it so gracefully"
