Reflections

Our faith in the Gospel Jesus enables us to see the Spirit of God in the most difficult and challenging times. The Spirit of God is "upon" us when we rise to challenge injustice and raise up God-inspired good in the midst of the darkest evil. God's Spirit opens our hearts to the possibilities for creating God's Kingdom in our midst: "glad tidings" for the poor, sight to the blind and light to the lost, justice for the oppressed, and a time of peace and fulfillment for all.

Connections SUNDAY

"Jesus reads the passage, which says that the Spirit of the Lord has sent him to "bring glad tidings to the poor, ... to let the oppressed go free," to proclaim a time of favour from the Lord (Is 61:1-2). This is what Ezra had done in the First Reading, but Jesus' mission is much, much more. A far greater new era has begun. He sits down now, at the same level as the people. He says almost casually, "today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." His mission is to rebuild their hearts, not just their city, to return them to God, who is their real home. Would they accept this startling new epoch? Will we?
