**Reflection**

*What will this child turn out to be?* The people of the countryside were filled with awe at the remarkable events surrounding the birth of John to an elderly, childless couple. His name is given not by his family but by God who has chosen him to prepare the way for Jesus. We too are specially chosen by God. As our spirit continues to mature, what will we turn out to be?

**Confirmation**

As we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation today we welcome **Archbishop Christopher Prowse, families** and **visitors** to our parish. We congratulate the thirteen children who will today renew their Baptismal promises and be anointed with chrism. We continue our prayer for the children and their families that their faith may be deepened, their witness be meaningful and that they trust in the guidance of Holy Spirit who has been 'confirmed' in them in a special way in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Pope Francis encourages us:

*"The rite of Confirmation recalls and renews the promises made at Baptism and invokes a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Just as Jesus received the outpouring of the Spirit at his baptism in order to carry out his messianic mission, the Church prays that we too may receive the gifts and fruits of the Spirit that enable us to help the Body of Christ grow in unity and missionary zeal. The gift of the Spirit is communicated through the laying on of hands and anointing with sacred chrism. Saint Paul sheds lights on the meaning of these sacramental signs when he says that "God... has anointed us, by putting his seal on us and giving us his Spirit in our hearts" (2 Cor 1:21-22). Sealed with the Holy Spirit, we are configured more closely to Christ and strengthened to bear*

*witness to him in our world. May each of us grow in gratitude for the gift received at our Confirmation and open our hearts ever more fully to the creativity of the Spirit who makes all things new."* 30 May 2018
