Reflection

This is my Body.' During the Passover meal the Jewish people remember God's saving deeds in the past. In this act of remembering, God's saving power is experienced in the present. Through the ritual meal of the last supper Jesus points to a future event, his crucifixion, in which his body will be broken and blood shed to inaugurate a new covenant between God and humankind. In the Eucharist we remember Christ's saving action and participate in its fruits.

Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ

This Sunday when we focus on the gift of God in Jesus and his gift to us in bread and wine let us reflect: St. Augustine, bishop of Hippo, put it this way in the 5th century:

"Be what you see, and receive what you are"

May we like Jesus allow our lives to be "taken, blessed, broken and shared" and in so doing become Eucharistic People.

On Friday 7 June we celebrate the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus—a day when we focus on the love of Jesus. May we take time to ponder how much

Jesus loves us individually and how we are called to be like him in giving expression to this personal love in our lives.
