She knew the prostitutes and alcoholics loitering in the back lanes of the city. In a climate of sectarianism, she loved and admired friends who were Protestant and Jewish. Once there was a poor lady who was ill, sitting in the gutter. Mary's companion thought she was drunk but Mary MacKillop sat down with the woman and realized that she needed help as she was ill. She helped the woman to the chemist shop where she could get assistance for her."

Mary had a special place in her heart for children, for the sick and lonely and for those who were suffering. She became a voice of God's love as she responded to all those in need. *May we entrust our needs to the intercession of Mary MacKillop*.
