Reflection

I am a sinner. In today's Scripture readings the prophet Isaiah, the apostle Paul and the apostle Peter each acknowledges that he is a sinner: 'I am a man of unclean lips', cries Isaiah, 'I persecuted the Church of God', confesses Paul; 'I am a sinful man', says Peter. They know their need of forgiveness but they are also aware of the power of God at work in them. We too are sinners, but if we have faith in the grace of God working within us, we can be great missionaries as well.

Sunday of the Word of God

As we focus on the Word in our Eucharist today we are reminded, "Most are no doubt familiar with the saying of Vatican II: "the Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she has venerated the Lord's body ... offering people the bread of life from the one table of the Word of God and the body of Christ (Dei Verbum 21)." In the same vein, the second document quotes St Jerome: "We are reading the sacred Scriptures. For me, the Gospel is the body of Christ; for me, the holy Scriptures are his teaching. And when he says: 'whoever does not eat my flesh and drink my blood' (Jn 6:53), even though these words can also be understood of the [eucharistic] Mystery, Christ's body and blood are really the word of Scripture, God's teaching."

How are the Sunday Readings chosen?

The earliest Christians simply read whatever scriptures were available in their community. The first "lectionaries," appearing by the fifth or sixth century, were actually just Bibles with notes in the margins telling the reader which passage to read on a particular Sunday. By the seventh century Mass readings began to appear in books of their own. After the 16th-century Council of Trent, all the readings and prayers for Mass had been collected in a single book called the Roman Missal. Vatican II restored the older practice of publishing the readings separately. The current Roman Catholic lectionary was created in 1970 by a commission set up after Vatican II to implement the council's liturgical reforms and has since been slightly revised twice.

The Gospel of Luke

This Liturgical Year we will focus on the Gospel of Luke in our Sunday readings. What do we know about the Gospel?

Luke wrote the Third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles in the city of Antioch, Syria. Antioch was one of the largest cities in the Roman Empire with a great variety of people. There were Jews and Gentiles as well as rich and poor. This helps us to understand Luke's audience as being composed mostly of Gentile converts of a mixed socioeconomic background. This greatly influenced the way Luke constructed his Gospel.
