

World Sick Day 11 February, Feast of our Lady of Lourdes

Pope Francis released a statement for World Sick Day.

"Praising those who help the sick and praying for those who are sick," Pope Francis called on Christians to practise what they preach, including by guaranteeing equal access to health care for all people. "The current pandemic has exacerbated inequalities in our health care systems and exposed inefficiencies in the care of the sick," the Pope wrote in his message for the 2021 World Day of the Sick. The COVID-19 pandemic has made it obvious to everyone that "elderly, weak and vulnerable people are not always granted access to care," at least not in an equitable way, he said. "This is the result of political decisions, resource management and a greater or lesser commitment on the part of those holding positions of responsibility." "Investing resources in the care and assistance of the sick is a priority linked to the fundamental principle that health is a primary common good," Pope Francis wrote.

Pope Francis praised the "silent multitude of men and women," who, as the pandemic continues, do not look away, but help their patients or their neighbours. "Such closeness is a precious balm that provides support and consolation to the sick in their suffering," he said. "As Christians, we experience that closeness as a sign of the love of Jesus Christ, the Good Samaritan, who draws near with compassion to every man and woman."
