First Communion

Baptism

This weekend we witnessed the Baptism in the Church coronation of King Charles 111—an ancient ritual that goes back to the time of King Solomon when he was anointed king. We too are anointed king, priest and prophet at our Baptism.

What does that mean for me?

"At your baptism you were marked with oil as a sign that you are consecrated to God and anointed by the Holy Spirit. Your anointing also was a sign that you are

- Signifies the gift of the Holy Spirit
- · A sign that the baptized shares in the three powers/functions of Christ:
- Prophet
- King
- A candle is lit from the flame of the paschal candle and given to the baptized (or parents)
- · Calls to mind the light of Christ, which is to be kept burning brightly

"A king usually is understood as ruling over others, but for the Christian, being a king is a call to servant-leadership. The role of our internal spiritual lives becomes clearer when we look at priest, prophet, and king together." ... "The key to the renewal of our society is a recovery of the deepest meaning of baptism, to become priestly, prophetic, and kingly people."

Reflection

"You and I now make up the community that is the household of God, where Jesus, the Father and the Spirit dwell.
