Journey to Jerusalem (part 1)

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

On the occasion of the Transfiguration (Lent 2) Luke told us that Jesus, Moses, and Elijah 'spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem'. We discussed how this was a reference to Jesus' approaching death /resurrection /ascension. This Sunday's gospel passage, just a few verses later, tells us that Jesus 'resolutely took the road for Jerusalem'. The Greek expression is, 'he firmly set his face to Jerusalem' This passage in Luke's gospel is significant in two ways.

Structurally, this passage introduces a large block of material sometimes called the great Lukan insertion or the big interpolation. Contained in these chapters is much material found only in Luke: several parables, some episodes that take place at meals, controversies, and so on.



Theologically, Luke introduces the theme of the journey to Jerusalem. Luke divides Jesus' ministry into three parts: the ministry in Galilee, the journey to Jerusalem, and the ministry in Jerusalem. The 'journey' section, which begins in this Sunday's gospel and culminates when Jesus arrives in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, is the middle and longest section of Luke's account of

Jesus' ministry. In these chapters Luke refers to Jesus' travelling some eight times, keeping the destination in front of the eyes of his readers.

Without overstating the case, there is a sense in which Luke uses geography in a theological way, that is, the journey becomes a metaphor for discipleship. This Sunday's episode begins with Jesus headed to Jerusalem where he will accomplish his mission (as he will later say, 'it is impossible that a prophet should die outside of Jerusalem'). The word 'journey' is repeated in verses 53 and 55; then the discussion turns to what it means to 'follow' Jesus. Just as the passage begins with Jesus firmly setting his face toward Jerusalem, it concludes with the warning that no one who 'looks back' is fit for the kingdom of God'. The journey of discipleship leads in one direction - to Jerusalem.

Feasts Days

27th - **St Cyril of Alexandria**, Bishop & Doctor of the Church, 370-444. Remembered for his ardent defence of orthodoxy, even at the cost of provoking condemnation and schism.

28th - **St Irenaeus**, Bishop, Martyr, 130-200. Remembered for his fidelity to apostolic tradition and traditionally venerated as a martyr.

29th - **St Peter & St Paul**, Apostles. Died as martyrs at Rome under Nero, between 64-67.

30th - **The First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church**. Blamed by the emperor Nero for the great fire which devastated Rome in 64, many Christians in addition to St Peter and St Paul were savagely killed, victims of cruel jealousy. Remembered for their endurance and unshakable faith.

First Collection for the Clergy. Did you know that it costs \$32 000 per year for each parish priest? The Bega Parish has had a long tradition of giving enough from the first collection to cover this cost & more. Since the first COVID lockdown the first collection has dropped & in 2021 only \$23 500 was received. So far this year we have collected \$12 000 and will most likely fall short again. If we are all able to contribute an extra \$2 each week, then we would make up this difference. There are many ways to contribute - via the plate at mass, using the
