

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A Word for the Weeds.

You can sum up today's long Gospel reading (Mt 13:24-43) in two words: Cool it! A most insightful piece of writing, it



comes with a take you wouldn't expect. It puts me in mind of something the late John O'Donohue wrote in his book Eternal Echoes (p.89): 'Where all danger is neutralized, nothing can ever grow'. And it's growth that Jesus' parable is concerned with: your growth, my growth and humankind's growth into the fullness of life.

Whatever harms life is alien to it. We don't come into this world with embedded seeds of self-destruction. God creates us for life, not death; for wholeness, not sickness; for happiness, not horror; for joy, not gloom; for hope not despair; and for glory not damnation.

Somewhere along the line things went wrong. Still do. And when they do we shouldn't get too hot and bothered about rooting out the cause. To put it starkly, we need to be able to live with sin. Not in it, but with it. For seriously minded people of



faith that is possible, but only when their God is benign. When they know God to be the Compassionate One, who fashioned this beautiful creation so lovingly knowing it would be marred by evil - the price to pay for freedom.

If God can live with weeks until the harvest, then so can we. So must we. They can't destroy the crop. No fear of that. But being violent with them will do more harm than good. So, cool it! God rules, not the weeds.

Finding Treasure.

'As soon as I believed there was a God, I understood that I could do nothing else but live only for Him. My



vocation came at the same time as my Faith. God is so great! There is such a vast difference between God and all that is not Him.' So writes St. Charles de Foucauld, once a pleasure-loving soldier in the French army - to a friend, Henry de Castries, in Paris. Charles experienced a spiritual transformation at the age of 28 and, after a period of searching, decided to go to the Sahara to be, as he puts it, 'among the lambs who were most neglected''. Assassinated on 1 December 1916, he is a saint worth getting to know! When he finds one pearl of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it. These are Jesus' words. It is love that explains the price paid by so many servants of the Word: missionaries, priests and so many parents and people of all walks of life. They



are willing to sacrifice their own comfort for the sake of the Kingdom. The parable of the dragnet is similar to that of the darnel. It seems that the process of hauling in this kind of net is such that no fish can escape. The Kingdom is like, not so much the net, as the whole process. The theme of Last judgement in Matthew 25 emphasises that love and service of neighbour, are the criteria for belonging to Jesus' Kingdom.
