Word made Flesh

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We return here again to the fallout from Jesus' miracle of the loaves and

fishes. The crowd is depicted as searching enthusiastically for Jesus but when they find him he confronts them on their motivation, saying they must look beyond their full stomachs to see what God is saying to them through what has taken place. What God is asking of them is that they believe in the one he has sent.

In the fourth gospel faith is not a concept, it is an activity. Believing in Jesus is the equivalent of doing the work that God wants because it involves a personal relationship, an abiding in him. However, the crowd don't understand and look for a

sign such as their ancestors received. The irony is that they have just such a sign in front of them but they fail to see it.



Jesus tells them he is the true bread, not like the manna, but the bread of God's word that satisfies the deepest human hunger. They are invited to nourish themselves on the bread of life, in other words to come to know and believe in Jesus. At this point in the narrative the evangelist is not yet speaking about the Eucharist — that will come later. Here he is making use of the Old Testament symbolism of wisdom as nourishment to speak of Jesus as the only one who can satisfy our hunger for God.

We only have to consider the number of cookery programmes on television to realise that food is big business and that it has little to do with feeding the hungry. In the developed world it is about novelty, the exotic, what is really healthy. We don't want the same old thing over and over because we get bored easily. In a certain sense, this type of potent symbol for what is being addressed in the readings. To quote from Deuteronomy, 'Human beings do not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God'. We hunger for meaning, a sense of purpose and if that is addressed then we can be truly content. This is what Jesus, as the bread of life, is speaking about. In him we can come to understand ourselves and be amazed at our own dignity and worth in the sight of God. We are, at heart, spiritual beings and if we don't address that, then we might easily spend our time satisfying our appetites and never our deepest need.

4th - **St John Vianney**, Priest 1786-1859. Remembered for his preaching and confessional counsel and is honoured as a model for parish clergy.

5th - The Dedication of St Mary Major. The feast celebrates the divine radiance shining in Christ's human flesh and God's glory shining forth in the lives of Christians.

6th - The Transfiguration of the Lord.

7th - **St Cajetan**, Priest 1480-1547. Remembered for his pastoral care, his reforming zeal, and his practical help for the poor and the afflicted.

7th - St Sixtus II, Pope & Companions, Martyrs. Died 258. Remembered as one of the most popular Roman martyrs, and mentioned in Eucharistic Prayer I. 8th - St Mary of the Cross, Virgin 1842-1909. Remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her

abiding trust in God's providence.

9th - **St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross**, (Edith Stein) Virgin & Martyr 1891-1942. Remembered as a victim of anti-Semitism, a scholar, contemplative and martyr for whom the cross is the key to spiritual understanding.

10th - **St Lawrence**, Deacon & Martyr Died in 258. Remembered in Eucharistic Prayer I, and in five ancient Roman churches dedicated to him.

Reflection for Vocations Awareness Week (Part 1).

When Jesus was asked for the true bread from heaven, he replied, 'I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.' In Jesus we have life, and life to the full - this is eternal life. And just as Jesus, the Light of the World, called his followers to let their own lights shine, Jesus, the Bread of Life, calls us to sow seeds of hope and peace in our world.

I wonder who has planted the seeds of faith in your own life? Who else has watered, pruned or harvested them? We might begin by remembering those people and giving thanks. Some may have planted the seeds long before we were born; some we have never met; and others have kept encouraging us throughout life. As Pope Francis says, let us "recall with gratitude to the Lord the faithful, persevering and frequently hidden efforts of all those who have responded to a call that embraces their entire existence."

We might first think of our parents, godparents or other family members. So many of Jesus' followers have a vocation to be a mother or father, or to nurture children in life and love so that they can flourish and produce a rich harvest. In Ephesians we are challenged to "follow Christ by loving as he loved you". Through relationships of love in a family, we make that love real every day, through the good and the bad times.
