

The Narrow Door

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first verse of the gospel reminds us that Jesus is 'making his way to

Jerusalem. The goal in view is the accomplishment of Jesus' mission: salvation through his dying and rising.



To gain access to salvation, one must enter through the narrow door. While salvation is made available to all, not all will enter. The door is narrow: one must try to enter, as in athletic competition (see 1 Cor 9:25; 1 Tim 6:12; 2 Tim 4:7). Though many compete in various games, winners are few in proportion to competitors. 'Trying' to enter through the narrow door implies both effort on the part of those seeking salvation and a judgment that not all will achieve their goal.

But the narrowness of the door is not the only obstacle: time is also critical. An hour will come when 'the master of the house has got up and locked the door'. We earlier encountered a door that was closed and locked: in the parable of the unexpected night visitor, the unprepared host goes to his neighbour and knocks on the door to ask for bread (Luke 11:5-8; see OT Sunday 17). On that occasion Jesus instructed his disciples to 'knock and the door will be opened for you' (11:9). The situation is different in this gospel. The opportunity to enter is not indefinite. Once the door is closed - once the end has come and judgment is pronounced - it is too late. A decision on the part of those who wish to enter is required now.

The protest of those who are locked out points again to the seriousness of effort required of those seeking salvation. It is not enough to have been casually acquainted with Jesus: 'We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets' (13:26). Those who wish to gain entrance must follow him to Jerusalem
