





In the Scriptures each of the three angels is named as a messenger of God, entrusted with special divine missions on earth. 30th - St Jerome, Priest & Doctor of the Church. 340-420. Often irascible **Feast** and intolerant, he is remembered for his asceticism & scholarship &, above all, for his incomparable service to the word of God. Davs 1st Oct - St Therese of the Child Jesus, Virgin & Doctor of the Church. this 1873-1897. Remembered for her humble obedience and her fidelity to Week ordinary duties as the path to sanctity. 2nd - The Holy Guardian Angels. The feast associates the human race with the eternal song of praise in heaven (Matthew 18:10). 4th - St Francis of Assisi. 1181-1226. Remembered for preaching the poor and crucified Christ in both word and humble action.

Rich and Poor

In the parable of Lazarus and the rich man, Luke returns to one of his major themes: the blessing of poverty and the danger of wealth. This powerful parable dramatises Mary's words in 1:52-53 - 'He has cast down the mighty from their thrones and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things and the rich he has sent away empty' It also fleshes out the contrast of 'beatitude and woe' found in the Sermon on the Plain: 'Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied ... But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation ... Woe to you who are filled now, for you will be hungry'. Though Jesus had instructed the wealthy to invite 'the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind' (Sunday 22), here is poor Lazarus literally sitting on the doorstep of the self-indulgent rich man and yet given not even a scrap.



Jesus himself announced the theme of blessings for the poor in his first sermon: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor' (Sunday 3). Luke has warned repeatedly of the dangers of wealth: 'Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions' (Sunday 18) and illustrated that warning with the parable of the rich fool (Sunday 18). He is explicit when he warns, 'How hard it is for those who have wealth to

enter the kingdom of God'. This Sunday's parable is an illustration of an earlier saying: the word of God is like seed which can be 'choked by the anxieties and riches and pleasures of life, and which fail to produce mature fruit'. This parable puts readers in the place of the rich man's brothers: we have Moses, the prophets, and the teaching of One raised from the dead. This is true wealth.
