Parousia: the Second Coming of Christ

The gospel speaks twice of the coming of the Son of Man. The Greek word for 'coming' is 'parousia' (pronounced 'par-OO-



see-ah' or 'par-oo-SEE-ah'). In everyday speech it means either 'presence' ('His letters are severe . . . but his bodily presence is weak,' 2 Cor 10:10) or 'arrival, coming, visit' ('God . . . encouraged us by the arrival of Titus,' 2 Cor 7:6). In religious and imperial settings parousia refers to the coming of the gods or the festive arrival of kings. In the NT its technical meaning derives from this latter sense, referring specifically to Christ's Second Coming in glory at the end of time. There are two noteworthy features of Christ's parousia: its exact time is unexpected and it brings judgment (for judgment, see Sunday 32).

The return of Christ in glory is part of a larger world view that envisioned the passing of this world and the establishment of the reign of God. The approach of that end time would be marked by various signs: the return of Elijah (whom the gospels identify as John the Baptist), natural calamities, persecution of the righteous, the coming of the mysterious 'Son of Man', and the defeat of Satan. Earliest Christianity saw in the ministry of Jesus signs that God's kingdom was indeed being established (e.g., the sick being cured, the lame walking, the dead



being raised) and that Satan was being defeated (e.g., many exorcisms). Moreover, once Jesus was identified with the 'Son of Man,' Christians looked for his final coming (parousia) and his revealing the kingship that is rightfully his. Paul expected Christ's return in his day ; as the parousia was delayed, Paul had to explain what would happen to those who died before Jesus returned in glory (1 Thes 4:13-15).

The delay of Christ's return required vigilance. Though there would be signs, the exact time was unknown. As the delay lengthened, the temptation to slack off grew proportionately. Hence the urging of these first Sundays of Advent to be vigilant and prepared.
