This weekend our Churches are open. This is good news, but, importantly, we are by no means 'back to normal'. This long weekend will see tourists come to the Valleythis should add to our sense of awareness. The parish will observe the new Archdiocesan COVID protocols- effective 1st June.

Protocols:

PMasses (Sundays & Weekdays) are to be celebrated with no more than 50 people.

†Communion in the hand only.

♦1.5metres distancing.

†Customary/recommended hygiene practices

♦ The obligation to attend Mass is still suspended- the 9:30am Mass will continue to be Live Streamed.

People entering churches need to sign a register at the door & use hand sanitiser.

\$\psi\$1st and 2nd Collection will be taken up together after the prayers of the faithful, No passing of the collection plate- Money collector will only handle money when wearing gloves. Counting will be done by the parish office.

†Touched surfaces are to be wiped down.

RECENTLY DECEASED Geoffrey O'Connell, Caleb Shaw, Ruth Glover, Noel Adams, ANNIVERSARIES Myles O'Reilly, Rosemary Tarlinton, John Jennings

9th - St Ephrem, Deacon & Doctor of the Church. 306-373. Called the "Harp of the Holy Spirit." Remembered for his poetic and dogmatic works, for his holy and ascetical life, and for his devotion to the Virgin Mary.

Feast Days

11th - St Barnabas, Apostle. A Jew from Cyprus and one of the first converts in Jerusalem, a leading member of the Church there, though not one of the twelve. He introduced St Paul to the twelve and worked with him in Antioch and on missionary work in the Mediterranean world. Championed the Week Gentiles at the Council of Jerusalem. Remembered as "a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith"

13th - St Anthony of Padua, Priest & Doctor of the Church. 1195-1231. Remembered and loved as an inspired preacher, a servant of the poor, and a worker of miracles.

Theophany - When God THE MOST HOLY TRINITY **Appears**

The first reading from Exodus describes a 'theophany' - a visible manifestation of the presence of God. Usually, the appearance of God (e.g., when God appeared to Moses on Mount Sinai) was accompanied by physical phenomena such as these: 'peals of thunder and lightning, and a heavy cloud over the mountain, and a very loud

trumpet blast . . . Mount Sinai was all wrapped in smoke, for the Lord came down upon it in fire. The smoke rose from it as though from a furnace, and the whole



mountain trembled violently' (note the cloud in this Sunday's first reading). Often such a terrifying sight inspired awe and fear; people kept their distance or covered their faces. It was believed that people who saw the face of God would die. In this Sunday's reading, as God becomes manifest in the cloud, 'Moses at once bowed down to the ground in worship'.

Yet despite the awe-inspiring and terrifying presence of God, Moses is told that 'the Lord

[is] a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity'. In the history of God's relationship with the chosen people God would unfailingly manifest fidelity and mercy; to be sure, sin was punished but the love of God never abandoned the people. The definitive manifestation of God's love comes in Jesus: 'God so loved the world that he gave his only Son'. The fidelity, kindness, and graciousness of God - accompanied by the terrifying phenomena described above now take physical form in the incarnation of Jesus, the Word made Flesh. The God who formerly could not be seen now appears in human form (Palm Sunday); the God who could not be approached is now approachable. The relationship between God and Israel was symbolised by the 'two stone tablets' Moses carried - the tablets of God's Law and covenant. But now that divine-human relationship is made personal in Jesus.
