Tax time has come, and Tanya will send out our yearly receipts. Thank you to all who make financial contributions to the Parish. "How much does it cost to run a parish?" This is somewhat of an open ended question. Like household's, parishes must adjust their spending to fit in with their income. As you would know all too well, a larger income gives more freedom in what we can do. Often 'the cheaper option' is not cheaper in the long run. In a Parish with over a 100 year history, our maintenance expenses can be a lot as we seek to pass on our parish for future generations.

Two forms have been prepared for those wishing to make Direct Debit contributions.

Direct Debit can now be made to the First (Blue From) and Second collection (Green form).

Direct Debit is the preferred way of receiving money from you. With the 2nd Collection- all the banking is done at the Parish Level (by Tanya).

1st Collection:

The first collection is pooled from all parishes and pays the priest stipend and living allowance. It also pays for the bishop (and makes contributions to the retired clergy). During Corona this saw a big reduction (some of which has been recovered- thanks to parishioners 'making up' for lost weeks). The diocese needed to reduce the priest's pay in order to not deplete the fund during Corona. Like many, we are now supported by JobKeeper for the next four months. I am happy to see that Bega's contribution are enough to support their priest.

Parable of the Sower

Matthew's telling of this well known parable highlights some of his favourite

themes. It is prominently placed as the first parable in Matthew's 'Sermon in Parables'. The 'Sermon in Parables' is central in 2 ways: it is the third of 5 sermons and chapter 13 is the middle of the gospel. All 8 parables in this sermon are about the kingdom of heaven. These fictitious stories taken from everyday life suggest aspects of the kingdom. Part of the appeal of parables is their resistance to definitive interpretation: it is not possible to say, 'This is the meaning.' Each of the parables

suggests rather than defines what the kingdom 'is like.'

Note, first, that the parable of the sower is not a lesson on agricultural technique nor a historical record with clues to ancient farming practices. Nor is it actually about the sower: the sower appears only in the first verse and then disappears. Nor is the parable about various kinds of soil, despite its great appeal to make moral points about ourselves, e.g., 'I am like the rocky ground.' The parable is about the seed, i.e.,

'the word of the kingdom'. The Sower (Jesus) scatters the seed extravagantly and indiscriminately: this is consistent with the abundance, generosity, and graciousness that characterise the kingdom. The superabundant harvest reiterates those themes and also points to the mysterious but certain ways in which God's kingdom grows.

The harsh quote from Isaiah 6:9-10 serves two purposes. First, in Jesus, Scripture is being fulfilled (Sunday 3); second, 'knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you', i.e., knowledge of the kingdom is revealed, not acquired (see last Sunday's gospel). Without this blessing, looking and hearing will not suffice; consequently, without revelation, conversion and healing are not possible. Though this may offend our egalitarian sensibilities, it highlights the core truth that the kingdom is God's doing, not a human accomplishment. All depends on grace.
