

'Proofs' of the Resurrection



In this Sunday's gospel Jesus presents to the startled and terrified disciples four different proofs that he is truly risen from the dead and is now standing before their very eyes: he invites them to (1) look at him; (2)



touch him; (3) give him something to eat; (4) understand the Scriptures. The first three proofs stress the corporeal, or bodily, aspects of the resurrection and reflect the Hebrew understanding of life-after-death. Jews of the biblical period thought of themselves as bodies animated by the breath of God. When the breath leaves, the body dies and nothing of the individual survives. This is very different from the Greek notion that people are composed of an immortal soul

inside a physical body. In Greek thought when the body dies, the soul is freed to live forever. For Jews, because the death of the body is final and nothing remains, the only way to survive death is if the body itself is resurrected after death. So Jesus, consistent with Jewish belief, stresses that he is not some shadowy kind of ghost but is really, physically, bodily present to them. His body has been resurrected - 'it is I indeed.' The One who 'spoke to you while I was with you' is speaking to them once again: the Crucified One is the Risen One. He can be seen, touched, and he can even eat. But, because Jesus ascended into heaven, he is no longer with us in the same way. These first three 'proofs' are not directly available to us and so we must rely on the testimony of eyewitnesses.

But the fourth proof, Sacred Scripture, is available to us. To say that Jesus 'opened their minds to understand the Scriptures' means that they were able to see that the entire Old Testament - 'the law of Moses, the prophets and psalms' testifies to him and indeed is fulfilled in him. For Christians, the death-andresurrection of Jesus is the key to the proper understanding of Scripture; and through Scripture, the risen Christ continues to speak to us today.
