

Ready to Serve?

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Given some of the difficult teaching of Jesus that the disciples have been

listening to, it is not surprising that they should now turn to Jesus and ask him to increase their faith. Once again, however, they find themselves on the receiving end of another comment that is hard to grasp. Instead of telling them how to increase their faith Jesus simply says that if their faith was the size of a tiny mustard seed then they could do amazing things. In the parable that follows we might have an explanation as to why he gave them such an answer.



The parable indicates that a servant's place is to serve and it is foolish to think of their role in any other way. Here Jesus is not be seen promoting systems that oppress; rather he is using an example from daily life to say to the disciples be careful that your attitude to God is not one of asking 'what's in it for me?' Again and again the gospel of Luke makes it very clear that the way of the disciple is hard but that is only because dying to yourself is hard. The paradox is that this is the only way to be really alive and at peace with the world.

We know that Paul was familiar with the writings of the Prophet Habakkuk since he quoted him in the letter to the Romans. 'The righteous person will live by faith.' Paul knew that his faith in Jesus had brought him to a new and dynamic relationship with God. This was 'righteousness' in his eyes, and his life had become a witness to it.

He worked long and hard and suffered much so that people of all religions and no religion could come to understand what God had done for them in Jesus. Now he is urging Timothy to a similar faithfulness, one that is based not on his own strength but on his awareness of the gift of the Spirit within. Habakkuk had wondered where the absent God was. Paul had come to know through faith in the crucified Christ that God was never absent but endured our suffering with us.

RECENTLY DECEASED: Michael Caragher, Bishop Patrick Power, Elaine Sawtell ANNIVERSARIES Loretta McDonald, Paul Malone, Daniel McCambridge

5th - St Faustina Kowalska, religious 1905-1938. Catholic Religious sister and mystic.

6th - St Bruno, Priest 1032-1101. Remembered especially for the poverty, solitude, and austerity of his way of life.

7th - Our Lady of the Rosary This commemoration was established in 1573 in thanksgiving for a Christian victory over the Ottoman forces at Lepanto 9th - St Denis, Bishop, Martyr and Companions, Martyrs. Died in Paris in the middle of the third century. Remembered as founder of the local Church of Paris 9th - St John Leonardi, Priest 1541-1609. Active in the years immediately after the Council of Trent, publishing a catechism and establishing a confraternity of Christian doctrine.

11th - St John XXIII, Pope 1958-1963. Promoted ecumenical movements in cooperation with other Christian traditions.

Minute Meditations - Jesus Sees You

One of my favourite verses in the stories of Jesus' healing ministry comes from the Gospel of Luke. It tells of Jesus healing at the end of a long day: "At sunset, all who had people sick with various diseases brought them to him. He laid his hands on each of them and cured them" (4:40). There is something so tranquil in this single, beautiful verse. But behind this tranquillity is something gritty and real: a man who was utterly consumed with compassion, who loved the crowds even when they pressed in on him and did not rest until he had touched every single one.

We may be overwhelmed by the needs of the world. We may fear that we don't have the stamina or the compassion of Jesus. But when Jesus looked at the crowds, he saw one person at a time—one need at a time. This must be our way too. Start with the person closest to you, and do what you can.
