

A Grateful Heart

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We have already seen that Samaritans can, despite the fact that their

neighbours consider them inferior, often be role models for Jesus. In today's gospel we see Jesus performing an act of healing. As with all of Jesus' miracles this was not performed simply to show he had the power but to allow the sick back into their community. In this case, a group of lepers who are excluded because of their illness can only stand far off and call to Jesus to heal them. This he readily does but the point made in the story is not that Jesus could do this but that people could still be so ungrateful. Blessed as we are in so many ways, it is easy to take things for granted. The Samaritan in the gospel is there to remind us that learning to say thanks is a simple way to nourish our relationship with God.



A useful image to take from these readings is that of the need for the soil to be right if we want God to take root in our lives. Namaan not only goes home cured but also aware of the need to change the way he looks at the world, in other words how he worships. Bringing home a couple of sacks of the soil of Israelis not to be understood as a superstitious act, but as an indication of his desire

to take on the ways of Yahweh who had restored him to health.

So too Paul advises Timothy that to be a good leader of a Christian community the essential first step is to ensure that he is firmly rooted in his relationship with Jesus. *Sean Goan*.

RECENTLY DECEASED: Michael Caragher, Bishop Patrick Power, Elaine Sawtell ANNIVERSARIES Loretta McDonald, Paul Malone, Daniel McCambridge

14th - St Callistus I, Pope & Martyr, died 222. Born a slave & served a sentence as a convict. Afterwards ordained a deacon & eventually elected bishop of Rome. 15th - St Teresa of Jesus, Virgin and Doctor of the Church 1515-1582. Honoured as a spiritual writer and mystic who experienced and comprehensively described the life of prayer.

16th - **St Margaret Mary Alacoque**, Virgin 1647-1690. After an unhappy childhood, entered a Visitation convent where she experienced several visions of Christ's love.

16th - St Hedwig, Religious. 1174-1243. Remembered for founding religious houses & hospitals, for her charity to the poor, & for her efforts at peacemaking.
 17th - St Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop & Martyr. Died 107. Remembered for seven letters written on his way to execution.

18th - St Luke, Evangelist. By early Christian tradition, Luke is named as author of the Third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. Almost certainly a Gentile and perhaps a companion of Saint Paul, he wrote to reassure those who had grown uncertain toward the end of the first century.

Minute Meditations - Divine Creativity

One In my own day-to-day living that I feel most alone and disjointed when I neglect the relational nature of my own life and reality. Non-relational thinking for me leads to days that feel lifeless and dry, lacking mystery and beauty. Non-relational thinking can lead to life becoming linear or transactional or regimented.

What this means is fountain fullness.
